National Young Adult Survey
January 2022

Overview

This report contains the results of a Civiqs survey of 1936 Americans age 17-39 from January 2-6, 2022. The survey was conducted online, among selected members of the Civiqs research panel. Sampled individuals were emailed by Civiqs and responded using a personalized link to the survey at civiqs.com.

The survey results are weighted by age, gender, race, education, and party identification to be representative of the population of Americans age 17-39. Respondents include an oversample of Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders (AAPI) to increase the precision of survey results for that subgroup. The general design effect due to weighting is 1.28. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 2.5\%$ at the 95% confidence level, accounting for the design effect. All survey results in this report are reported as percentages.
